Sally the sardonic seagull and Peter the positive pigeon are the stars of a new film to show off Great Yarmouth to residents of its twin town in France.

The film, produced by young people in conjunction with the youth charity MAP, is called Yarmouth's Got A Twin and it was made for the Great Yarmouth and Rambouillet Twinning Association.

It follows the two birds on a whistlestop tour of the resort, and will be shown to people in Rambouillet in France.

A special screening was held at MAP's offices in Deneside, and members of the audience were impressed.

"I thought all the work the young people put in was very inspirational," said Shirley Weymouth, Mayor of Great Yarmouth. "The film gives an overview of Great Yarmouth and the special events that are put on annually, which make Yarmouth a very special place to live.

"They have made a



fabulous film that we are proud of."

The film follows its two feathered protagonists around some well-known Great Yarmouth spots including Haven Bridge and the train station.

They also meet the chairman of the twinning association and Mayor Mrs Weymouth.

Local filmmaker Matthew Harrison helped turn the young people's ideas into film.

He taught them skills including script

writing, filming and editing.

The project lasted about a year and captured most of the town's annual events.

The young people involved will soon be able to watch a similar film made by young people in Rambouillet.
